



- This is a effective tool for teachers to use for several purposes.
- •It can be used for teachers to monitor their instruction on different components of notebooking. When a unit of instruction is completed they can look for evidence of the components in several notebooks. If they **do not find evidence** of any components and lots of evidence of others they can deduce that **they have not given equal time to all components.**
- You can also **give this to the students** and have them look for the different components. This is a wonderful way for students to self assess. By requiring students to locate evidence of components they will be required to use higher level thinking skills.
- •Students can also use this tool for peer assessment and give feedback to classmates using the checklist.
